## A Visit to the Badlands

In the wee hours of a September morning, one hundred and twenty five years ago, a 24 year old man stepped off a train in a little North Dakota town. The man was the future President Theodore Roosevelt and the town was Little Missouri.

The young Roosevelt had come to North Dakota anticipating an exciting bison hunt. However, upon his arrival he found the large herds were gone, dissipated by disease and over hunting. It took Theodore 10 days to shoot a bison, but in those 10 days he fell in love.

Roosevelt fell in love with

the badlands and the cowboy lifestyle. Before returning to New York he entered into a partnership to raise cattle on

and established the Elkhorn Ranch. Theodore spoke very highly of his time in North Dakota, writing in his journal about the beauty of the land and the life of the cowboy.

Today the land and solitude he fell in love with is still waiting for you to experience and explore. The bison were reintroduced in 1956 and roam freely throughout the park. On a quiet day one can sit under a tree in the park and imagine what it might have been like to be Theodore Roosevelt in the badlands of North Dakota.







tion at the South Unit Visitor Center. The Governor's proclamation will be read and there will be a special program or two about Roosevelt and the park.

All park friends and neighbors are invited to the party. Birthday cake and punch, provided by TRNHA, will be served to honor Roosevelt.



"We might even sing Happy Birthday" said Superintendent Naylor. "This will be fun."

TRNHA will provide special envelopes with an attractive cachet honoring Roosevelt's life and will also have 150<sup>th</sup> birthday shirts, pins, and magnets available for purchase.

Theodore Roosevelt's time in the North Dakota badlands was instrumental in his recovery from the deaths of his wife and mother. It was here that he formulated many of his ideas about conservation and the wise use of resources. He also learned a lot from the people of the west and his experience in Dakota molded him into the president he would become.

Please join us in honoring Roosevelt on his 150<sup>th</sup> birthday!






### Jeani Borchert






Another project which is still underway is the construction of a new website. Lots of hours have been put


### Medora's Old Fashion Cowboy Christmas December 5th & 6th

## Bison Roundup a Success

The first week in November was a busy one for park staff as they prepared for and conducted a bison roundup in the South Unit of Theodore Roosevelt National Park. Prior to the round up biologist estimated the bison herd population at about 322. The roundup began on the morning of November 4th and ended in the early afternoon of November 5th when winter weather rolled in to the badlands.

Wildlife Biologist, Mike Oehler,



calls this years bison roundup a success. Mike said "Without a doubt, this year's South Unit Bison roundup was one of the most challenging and rewarding roundups of the 7 in which I have been involved."

The first day of the round up went off with out a hitch but the second day bad weather challenged the staff and air operations.

At the end of day two 182 animals had been processed with 77 returning to the park and 105 being sent to various locations throughout the country. Seven of the adult females returned to the park were fitted with GPS collars. These collars help biologist monitor herd movement and grazing habits.



It is now estimated that 245 bison roam the South Unit. Management of other ungulates in the South Unit may effect the exact date of the next bison round up but Mike believes another bison roundup should not have to be conducted until 2012 or 2013.

## Christmas Recipes

### Ginger Snaps

#### Ingredients

2 3/4 cups self-rising flour  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1 teaspoon ginger  
1/4 teaspoon cloves  
1 cup brown sugar, packed  
3/4 cup margarine or butter, softened  
1 egg  
1/4 cup light molasses



PREPARATION: Mix flour, soda, and spices in a bowl and set aside.

Cream sugar and margarine, beat in egg and molasses until light and fluffy. Stir in flour mixture. Chill for 2 hours. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Shape dough into 3/4-inch balls, roll in sugar, and place on greased baking sheets about 2 inches apart. Flatten each ball with the bottom of a glass dipped in sugar. Bake about 8 to 10 minutes, until set. Makes 8 dozen cookies.

### Easy Cheese Ball

#### Ingredients

2 (8 ounce) pkgs. cream cheese, softened  
1 pkg. ranch dressing mix  
2 1/2 c. shredded Cheddar cheese  
1 1/2 c. chopped pecans



PREPARATION: In a medium size bowl, mash cream cheese. Mix dressing mix and Cheddar cheese into the cream cheese. Shape the mixture into a ball. Roll the ball in the chopped nuts. Refrigerate covered until ready to serve.


